Sustainable land use is an important approach to the preservation of ecosystems services, one that requires the negotiation of diverse and conflicting social, ecological, political and economic goals. The Global Landscape Forum (GLF) is a scientifically led, cross-sectoral platform that provides global support for this landscape approach. It produces and disseminates knowledge that promotes landscapes which are more resilient, climate-friendlier, more diverse, more equitable and more productive. The GLF offers a learning lab as well as collaborative platforms and events to build up knowledge and resources in the field of sustainable land use and make them accessible worldwide. The project funding was increased to to prepare a successful UN Decade for Ecosystem Restoration 2021-2030 jointly with UNEP, FAO and IUCN .

State of implementation/results

- The Global Landscapes Forum (GLF) has a thriving, global community centered on action and is a core partner to the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration 2021-2030 and the Global Environment Facility funded Food Systems, Land Use, and Restoration (FOLUR) Impact Programme. 2020-21 Achievements: catalyzing local restoration and biodiversity action and scaling solutions.
- 2-3 June 2021: First ever digital conference focused entirely on Africa's drylands - GLF Africa: "Restoring Africa's Drylands: Accelerating Action On the Ground"
- The Generation Restoration Stewards program supports the projects of youth restoring landscapes around the world.
- The GLFx initiative bridges local action and global agendas through independently organized chapters committed to conserve, protect and restore landscapes.
