

Brazil, Colombia, India, South Africa, China as well as Tanzania possess significant levels of biodiversity, while also experiencing developmental pressures, making the management of biodiversity challenging, but essential, as it can make a critical contribution to sustainable development, particularly in the context of climate change. Despite existing national policies and plans, limited resources exist at the sub-national government level in the target countries to plan and implement biodiversity management measures. The project supports these countries in establishing the management of biodiversity and ecosystems as a cross-sectional task and as the joint responsibility of national, regional and local authorities.

What is CitiesWithNature? How can biodiversity be mainstreamed in local urban plans? Which co-benefits can bring pilot measures fostering a richer biodiversity? How can local governments finance biodiversity projects?
