


Figure 1: Sectorial scenarios to be modelled.


### **Key issues:**

- Mitigation Actions: To be finalized after Stakeholder consultations – It is expected that additional ones will come from stakeholders
- Multi-Criteria Assessment: Criteria and Weighting to be finalized by the CCD and Climate Change Committee with inputs from stakeholder workshops

### NDC Implementation and Resource mobilization strategy

Resource Mobilization; aimed to search and acquire the requisite volumes of climaterelated finance capital for the implementation of various activities that contribute towards achieving the goals set in the updated NDC.

Climate finance is sought from different sources which may differ in their funding requirements and modalities of the finance that they issue.
