Climate Change COP26 Achievements - Implications for the IKI

The COP26 achieved what many believed to have been impossible: the joint final declaration from all the 197 countries, on an agreement to accelerate the global energy transition away from coal and to eliminate subsidies for fossil fuels. The Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation and Nuclear Safety (BMU) actively supports the COP decisions through its IKI projects. Apart from working with various countries to realise these decisions, IKI is also reviewing the goals set by the new COP26 alliances, agreements and declarations to determine which of these should form part of IKI's funding calls, funding contributions and strategy.
